

BUILDING BOND PAID OFF!!!

The library took out a \$1.3 million bond in 1999 to pay for a remodeling project that expanded the library's operable space from one to two floors. This is a historic time for our community. We just wrote the last check to pay off that bond. In the past 15 years we have circulated over 4.5 million books, movies, and CDs, had over 2.6 million visits to the library, had over 23,000 uses of our meeting room spaces, answered over 776,000 reference questions, provided over 634,000 individual sessions on our computers totaling well over 500,000 hours of computer use, and received over 18,000 hours assistance from volunteers. In 2000, the library employed the equivalent of 17 full-time staff; today we employ the equivalent of 43 full-timers. We owned slightly over 100,000 books, CDs, and videos 15 years ago, while today our collection holds 175,000 items, not including the 27,000 e-Books and 18,000 audiobooks available for download. Other highlights of our service over the past decade include commissioning a bookmobile, installing a multimedia digital lab, adding a Teen Zone, introducing therapy dogs in our reading programs, adding the biggest and most diverse Spanish language and the best Anime collections in Lake County, and developing nearly two dozen partnerships with area organizations. Thank you to the residents who supported the library's expansion several years ago and for the hard work everyone put into passing the building referendum. This is a shining moment for the entire community.




