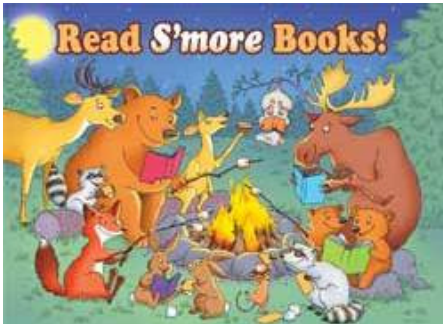

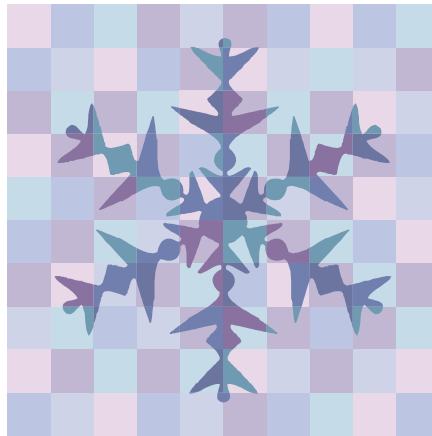


Village of Round Lake Beach Cultural & Civic Center Hosts a Special Library Event

Round Lake Area Public Library Policy Regarding Unsupervised Minors

The following summarizes a policy adopted by the Library Board of Trustees on March 15, 2006.

Children under the age of 10 must be accompanied by a caregiver age 14 or older while in the library. If a child under the age of 10 is attending a library program that does not require a caregiver to be present, the caregiver should remain inside the library building.

Children must be picked up promptly when the library closes. In the event a child under the age of 18 is left without a ride home after the library has closed, the library staff will attempt to contact the child's caregiver by phone. If a caregiver cannot be contacted after 20 minutes, library staff will contact the Round Lake Police Department to take custody of the child.

Normas de Conducta Sobre Menores Sin Supervisión en la Biblioteca

Lo siguiente es un resumen de las normas adoptadas por el Consejo de Administración de la Biblioteca en Marzo, 2006.

Niños menores de 10 años deben estar acompañados a toda hora en la biblioteca por un guardián de 14 años o mayor. Si un niño menor de 10 años atiende un programa donde no se requiere la presencia de un guardián, el guardián responsable deberá permanecer en la biblioteca.

Por favor asegúrese de llegar por su hijo puntualmente después de que la biblioteca cierre. En caso de que un menor de 18 años se quede esperando, el personal intentará comunicarse con los padres/guardián. Si después de 20 minutos no hay contacto, se le avisará al Departamento de Policía para que tomen custodia del menor.



Food for Fines Program April 11-17, 2011

Patrons with late charges on their library accounts will be able to reduce or eliminate their fines, and help replenish a local food pantry serving the community's less fortunate. "We invite the public to join us in this time of giving by donating to someone in need," said Public Relations Coordinator Elena Lara. "We want to encourage our patrons to come back and use the library's resources." Food for Fines, enables Round Lake library card holders to reduce their fines by a maximum of \$25.00. Each item donated will allow a \$1 reduction in fines. All items collected will benefit the Avon Township Food Pantry.

Patrons are advised that food items are being accepted for fines only and not for lost or replacement materials. When a patron returns lost materials, food may be donated in lieu of the fines for that returned item. Food may not be used to pay for any collection or other fees. **Accepting non-perishable items, including shampoo, soap, and toothpaste.**
****Note: This fine-reduction program is available only to Round Lake Library card holders.**
