



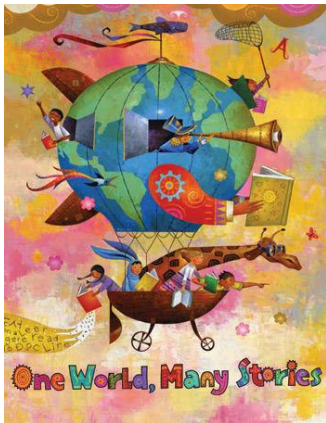

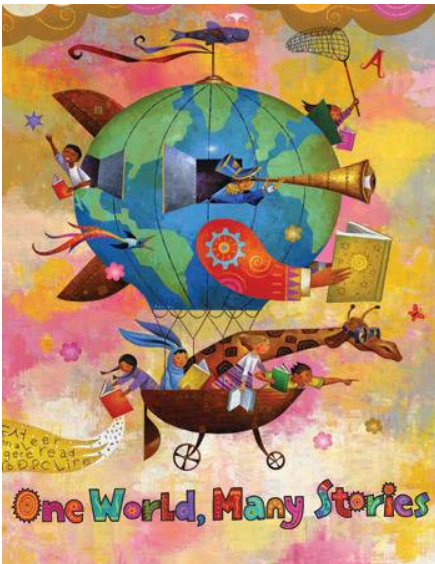

Round Lake Area Public Library Policy Regarding Unsupervised Minors

The following summarizes a policy adopted by the Library Board of Trustees on March 15, 2006.

Children under the age of 10 must be accompanied by a caregiver age 14 or older while in the library. If a child under the age of 10 is attending a library program that does not require a caregiver to be present, the caregiver should remain inside the library building.

Children must be picked up promptly when the library closes. In the event a child under the age of 18 is left without a ride home after the library has closed, the library staff will attempt to contact the child's caregiver by phone. If a caregiver cannot be contacted after 20 minutes, library staff will contact the Round Lake Police Department to take custody of the child.

Niños menores de 10 años deben estar acompañados a toda hora en la biblioteca por un guardián de 14 años o mayor. Si un niño menor de 10 años atiende un programa donde no se requiere la presencia de un guardián, el guardián responsable deberá permanecer en la biblioteca.

Por favor asegúrese de llegar por su hijo puntualmente después de que la biblioteca cierre. En caso de que un menor de 18 años se quede esperando, el personal intentara de comunicarse con los padres/guardián. Si después de 20 minutos no hay contacto, se le avisará al Departamento de Policía para que tomen custodia del menor.

A BookScan Station is now available for copying book pages, documents, and photos that can be printed, saved on a USB Flash drive or CD, or e-mailed as an attachment. on an easy-to-use touchscreen with user-friendly instructions. The scanning process includes setting options for file formats, DPI resolution, black and white or color, and file names. This station is located in the Adult Services Department.

New Computers with Windows 7

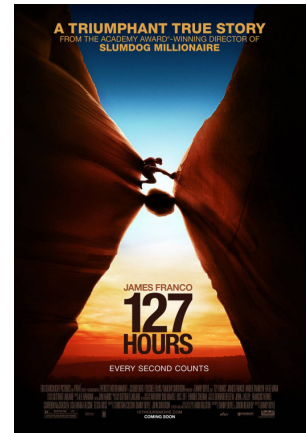
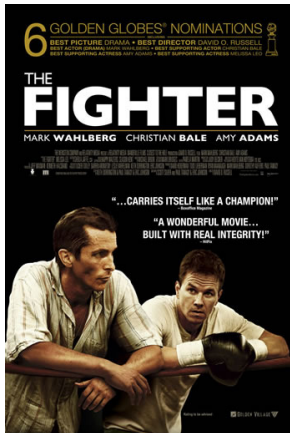


